## This 3-month program provides:

### Technical Training:

- Become a web developer
- Learn Full Stack Development from basic to advanced using HTML5, CSS3, JavaScript, NodeJS, Databases and GitHub.
- The training is led in an AGILE environment using tech workplace tools (Confluence, Slack, Jira, etc.)

### Soft Skills Training & Career Preparation:

- Enhance your study skills and teamwork.
- Target your resume for a tech career, prepare for interviews, and build a tech portfolio.

### One-on-One Coaching and Mentoring:

- Receive one-on-one coaching and support.
- Build your network and knowledge with our volunteer tech mentoring professionals.

## By the end of this program, you will be able to:

1. Create mobile and tablet responsive webpages
2. Create basic web applications and games
3. Problem solve, debug and fix issues
4. Apply Agile development protocols; use GitHub
5. Contribute to the entire software development lifecycle (SDLC)

## Eligibility

### Applicants must meet the following criteria:

- Facing barriers to education and employment
- Currently unemployed or underemployed
- Not in education or returning to school
- 17 - 29 years of age
- Live in Ontario
- Canadian citizen, Permanent Resident, or Approved Refugee
